



## CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION IN THE FISHERIES OF ANGUILLA AND MONTSERRAT

### #Living with Climate Change

#### Contest Info Sheet

##### About the contest

The #Living with Climate Change contest is being held as part of the Darwin Plus funded project [\*Climate change adaptation in the fisheries of Anguilla and Montserrat\*](#) from 2017-2020. The goal of the project is to mainstream climate change adaptation into fisheries governance and management in Anguilla and Montserrat, using an ecosystem approach to fisheries. The Caribbean Natural Resources Institute (CANARI) is partnering with the Fisheries and Ocean Resources Unit, Ministry of Agriculture, Trade, Lands, Housing and Environment (MATLHE) in Montserrat for the contest.

Participants will help to document local perspectives on impacts of climate change and priorities for adaptation in the fisheries of Montserrat. They will add to local knowledge and share experiences and stories on impacts of climate change to the fisheries sector and associated livelihoods, and gather ideas and possible solutions and priorities for tackling climate change.

The stories shared via videos and photos will be used for awareness raising and mobilising action on climate change in Montserrat's fisheries.

##### FAQs

###### Who can enter the contest?

- Fisherfolk (fishers, fish vendors, processors, boat crew etc.) and fisherfolk organisations
- Dive and tour operators
- Local community stakeholders with stories to tell on climate change and its impacts on the fisheries sector - local NGOs, school children, youth groups, women's groups and members of the general public

***Eligibility: Participants must be age 16 or above, must be resident of Montserrat, cannot be a staff member or affiliate of CANARI or the Fisheries and Ocean Resources Unit, Montserrat, and cannot be professional photo/videographers.***

###### What do I need to do to enter?

- Complete the Entry form attached and email with your photo or video to [communications@canari.org](mailto:communications@canari.org), Or complete the online Entry form at <https://goo.gl/forms/iLtMZb9Cccpat1o62> and submit your photo or video via WhatsApp to 1 868 399 0745
- Entry forms must be fully completed, signed and submitted for entries to be valid and for photo and videos to be considered eligible.
- A new separate form should be submitted for each Entry.

###### What are the photo and video requirements?

- Participants may submit multiple entries.
- Photos and videos must be an original creation; any stock photos or footage or other borrowed material used in producing videos must be used with the expressed permission of the original producer and give credit accordingly.

- Videos must be two minutes or less. Submissions that exceed 2 minutes of playing time will not be considered.
- Video files must be in one of the following formats: .mp4, .mov, .avi, or .wmv. We will not accept a link to a YouTube video, a hosted site or physical DVDs.
- Minimum video quality is 480p Standard Quality.
- Videos must be recorded and/or narrated in English.
- Video content must be technically accurate if presenting scientific information.
- Videos should not contain or encourage dangerous or unsafe activities.
- Photos must be of good quality - at least 2.5MB in size and 300 dpi.
- Photos will be acceptable in .jpeg or .png formats.
- All photos must carry appropriate captions no longer than 50-100 words.
- Photo series or collages may be submitted (including up to five photos).

### **How will the photos and video submissions be judged?**

Judging criteria will be based on:

- Relevance to topic and questions presented (i.e. speaks to climate change and fisheries of Montserrat)
- Power of the message
- Credibility of information provided
- Sharing of local knowledge
- Creativity

### **When will I hear back or know about results of the contest?**

- CANARI staff will contact all participants to confirm receipt of entry forms and their photo or video entries
- CANARI staff will directly contact participants whose entries were successful by February 2019 and send out a general notice on results of the contest.

### **Contest Rules and Regulations**

- Photos and video entries must be original, produced by amateurs, not produced for any other purpose, compensation or previously posted on the Internet or used in any other medium.
- Contest participants grant CANARI permission to use, publish, duplicate, display, distribute, modify, and edit any photos and video submitted to the Contest
- CANARI reserves the right not to select any of the submitted videos or photos if it determines in its sole discretion that none of the entries are of sufficient quality.
- CANARI reserves the right to disqualify and/or destroy entries that are determined, in its sole discretion, to violate the law, violate the rights of third parties, depict violence or otherwise be detrimental to the interests of CANARI or any other party.
- CANARI has the sole discretion to interpret the Contest rules, make decisions in accordance with the Contest rules, amend the Contest rules to ensure the Contest operates in accordance with CANARI's intent and purpose in developing the Contest.
