

MONTSERRAT TRAVEL PROTOCOLS



The following persons are allowed to travel to Montserrat

- (a) Montserratians;
- (b) The husband, wife, child or other dependant of a Montserratian, whether travelling with or separately from the Montserratian;
- (c) A person who holds a permit of permanent residence;
- (d) A person who is ordinarily resident on Montserrat;
- (e) A person who owns a habitable house/home on Montserrat;
- (f) The husband, wife, child or dependant of a person who falls under categories (c), (d) or (e) whether travelling with or separately from the person, once the husband, wife, child or dependant resided in Montserrat, for any period of time, prior to 16th March, 2020;
- (g) A professional person who has been engaged by an entity in the public or private sector, and who has been granted permission by the Minister of Health to enter Montserrat, prior to travelling to Montserrat;
- (h) A member of the crew of an aircraft or ship;
- (i) A non-resident technician, once he has been granted permission to enter Montserrat prior to travelling to Montserrat.
- (j) A person, granted permission by the Minister, for the purpose of aiding with preparations for a disaster or after a disaster.
- (k) A person who has been granted a remote employment stamp;
- (l) An attorney-at-law, judge or other officer of the court for the purpose of appearing in, or presiding over court proceedings;
- (m) A parent, child, **grandchild** or sibling of a deceased person, once the Minister has granted permission to enter Montserrat for purposes ancillary to the death of the person to include attending the funeral of the person;
- (n) A fully vaccinated person who has been granted permission by the Minister to enter Montserrat for the purpose of aiding a person who is seriously ill or for the purpose of aiding with an emergency situation in relation to a person in Montserrat;
- (o) A parent, child or sibling of the spouse of a deceased person, once permission has been granted by the Minister to enter Montserrat for purposes ancillary to the death of the person to include attending the funeral of the person;
- (p) **A fully vaccinated visitor who does not fall within paragraphs (a) to (o) and who intends to remain in Montserrat for no more than ninety (90) days;** and
- (q) Any other person, as may be determined by the Minister, for the purpose of aiding in the suppression of COVID-19.

*Minister means Minister of Health

MONTSERRAT TRAVEL PROTOCOLS

Before you travel, you must register!
You must also follow all protocols



1 CONFIRM ACCOMMODATION

Ensure that you have confirmed where you will stay while on Montserrat.

If you plan to stay with family, ensure that they are aware, as the entire household may be quarantined for 5 days (fully vaccinated) **or** 14 days (not fully/not vaccinated) .

2 NEGATIVE COVID-19 PCR TEST / RNA TEST REQUIRED PRIOR TO TRAVEL

Test should be taken no earlier than 5 days prior to travelling.

Persons not required to take the PCR Test/RNA Test before travelling are:

- a.** A child **under 5 years of age**
- b.** a person entering Montserrat in circumstances related to a medical evacuation.
- c.** a person granted permission by the Minister to enter Montserrat for the purpose of aiding with preparations for a disaster or after a disaster.

3 COMPLETE & SUBMIT ACCESS DECLARATION FORM

The form is available on the Government Website www.gov.ms

The form, must be submitted 72 hours/ 3 days before travelling

4 ONLY AIR TRAVEL ALLOWED

Only air travel via Fly Montserrat or SVG Air is permitted

All persons must wear a mask or face covering on the aircraft, and while being processed at the Airport.

You will be required to engage in a screening process with the Port Health Officers, before proceeding to Immigration and Customs.

Fully Vaccinated Persons - Quarantine & Testing Protocols



A person is considered fully vaccinated –

(a) fourteen days after receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose COVID-19 vaccine series;

or

(b) fourteen days after receipt of one dose of a single-dose COVID-19 vaccine.

- Quarantine period - **5 days**
- Quarantine at home, place of occupancy, designated quarantine facility or place of isolation.
- PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 test between three and four days after entry. If negative for COVID-19 he or she can leave quarantine on day 5.
- If the individual is expected to leave Montserrat before the 5 days have passed he or she will be allowed to leave Montserrat.

NOTE: A fully vaccinated person is **NOT** required to take a PCR or RNA COVID-19 test 24 hours after arriving on Montserrat.

Persons NOT Fully Vaccinated - Quarantine & Testing Protocols



- Quarantine period - **14 days**
- Quarantine at home, place of occupancy, designated quarantine facility or place of isolation.
- PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 test within **24 hours of entry**.
- PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 test between **12 and 14 days** after entry. If negative for COVID-19 he or she can leave quarantine on day 14.
- If the individual is expected to leave Montserrat before the 14 days have passed he or she will be allowed to leave Montserrat.

Non-Resident Technicians- Testing Protocols



Fully Vaccinated

- PCR or RNA COVID-19 test no earlier than 5 days prior to entry into Montserrat
- PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 test within **24 hours of entry** into Montserrat.
- Remain at his/her place of occupancy and only be in a public place for the purpose of travelling to and from the place of work.
- On the expiration of **five days** after his/her entry into Montserrat, a non-resident technician who is **fully vaccinated** is allowed to be in a public place, other than his/her place of work.
- He/she is **not** required to take a COVID-19 test before being allowed in public places, after 5 days on island.





Non-Resident Technicians- Testing Protocols

Not Fully Vaccinated



- PCR or RNA COVID-19 test no earlier than 5 days prior to entry into Montserrat.
- PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 test within **24 hours of entry**.
- Remain at his/her place of occupancy and only be in a public place for the purpose of travelling to and from the place of work.
- If the **unvaccinated** non-resident technician is staying in Montserrat for more than 5 days, he/she must take a COVID-19 test on day 5 of his stay.
- An unvaccinated non-resident technician is required to take a COVID-19 test between 12 and 14 days after entering Montserrat. He/she may be in a public place after day 14, if the day 12-14 test is negative.

Protocols for Children

A child -

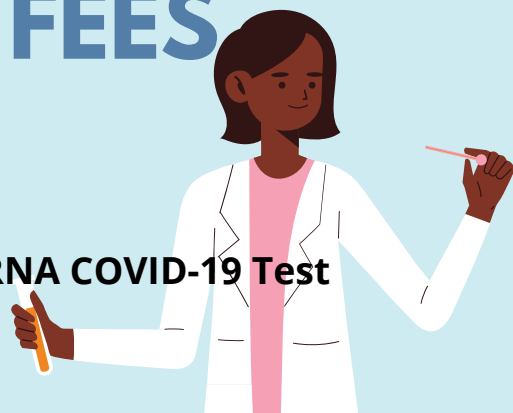
- **5 years** of age and over -- take a PCR COVID19/RNA COVID19 Test no earlier than five days prior to entering Montserrat;
- Under 18 years of age is **NOT** required to be tested for COVID-19 within 24 hours of arrival.
- Under 18 years of age shall remain in quarantine for the same period as the adult who accompanied him/her to Montserrat.
- Under 18 years of age is required to take a PCR/RNA COVID-19 test before the expiration of the self-quarantine, on the same day as the adult who accompanied the child to Montserrat.
- **Over 2 years of age** is required to take a PCR/RNA COVID-19 test before the expiration of the self-quarantine, on the same day as the adult who accompanied the child to Montserrat.

Unvaccinated Pilots Protocols

A pilot who is not fully vaccinated and who navigates a flight into Montserrat on a habitual basis shall take a PCR COVID-19 Test or RNA COVID-19 Test every 14 days.



COVID-19 TEST FEES



The fee payable for a PCR COVID-19 test or RNA COVID-19 Test is as follows:

(a) Test taken within 24 hours of entry into Montserrat by a person who is not fully vaccinated.	\$300.00
(b) Test taken 5 days after entry into Montserrat by a non-resident technician who is not fully vaccinated.	\$300.00
(c) Test taken between 3 to 4 days after entry into Montserrat by a fully vaccinated person.	\$150.00
(d) Test taken between 10 to 12 days after entry into Montserrat by a person who is not fully vaccinated person, to include a non-resident technician who is not fully vaccinated.	\$150.00
(e) A person listed in (b), (c) and (d) who is being retested following a positive test result.	\$150.00
(f) A test being taken by any other person, in circumstances not listed in (a) to (e)	\$300.00
(g) A test being taken by a person under 18 years of age	FREE

***All fees listed above are in Eastern Caribbean Dollars (XCD)**

Please Note

A person is considered fully vaccinated 14 days after receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose COVID-19 vaccine series.

A person is considered fully vaccinated 14 days after receipt of one dose in a single-dose COVID-19 vaccine.

A **non-resident technician** means a person who travels to Montserrat for the purpose of assisting with certification and maintenance of equipment.
